

### TO DO AND NOT TO DO

### Do not disrespect Latvian culture:

Try to learn the basics of local culture and traditions so as not to violate generally accepted norms of behavior and not cause misunderstandings.

### Don't ignore language skills:

Although many Latvians speak English, try to learn at least a few basic phrases in Latvian. This will show your respect for the local culture.

### Avoid being rude or fussy:

Latvians are usually characterized by calmness and moderation. Avoid loud behavior or disrespectful behavior.

### Do not take photographs without permission:

If you want to photograph people or their property, it is best to ask permission first. This is especially true in places related to religion or people's personal lives.

### Do not wear clothes that may offend:

Avoid clothing with Nazi symbols, as well as images and messages that may be offensive or provocative.



# TO DO AND NOT TO DO

### Do not violate public rules:

Keep the streets tidy and clean, do not litter public places, follow the rules of public transport.

### Avoid touching historical and cultural sites:

Remember that many monuments and historical sites are part of the national heritage. Do not touch them or damage their integrity.

### Do not smoke in unauthorized places:

Obey smoking laws and regulations. Smoking is prohibited in some places and violation may result in a fine.



### **USEFUL TIPS**

### Greetings:

When meeting and parting, we usually greet with a handshake and say the phrase "Labdien!" (good afternoon) or "Sveiki!" (Hello). When saying goodbye, it is customary to say "Uz redzēšanos!" (goodbye) or "Atā!" (Bye)

### Respect for holidays and traditions:

If you are in the country during a national holiday, you should respect traditions and participate in the festivities.

### Removing shoes:

It is customary to remove shoes in homes and some public places. If you see shoes at the entrance, this is a hint.

### Punctuality:

It is important to stick to time, especially in a work and business context. Accuracy is valued here.

### Respect for nature:

Latvians care about nature. Keep public places clean and do not litter.



### **USEFUL TIPS**

### Clothing:

Wearing neat clothing in public is recommended, especially in more formal situations.

### Respect for elders:

In Latvian culture respect for elders is an important part. Address people by their first and last names, using the form "kungs" (Mr.) or "kundze" (Mrs.).

#### Invitation to visit:

If you are invited to visit, it is good form to bring a gift to the hosts, for example, flowers or sweets.
